Purpose

To award a \$2,500 scholarship to the student who has made a difference in their community through involvement and volunteerism. The scholarship is awarded to a student whose efforts "stand out" from others. This scholarship is not based on grades, class rank, ACT scores, or financial need. We are looking for the service-minded student who has demonstrated that their heart is dedicated to helping others at school, church, or within their community.

Eligibility and Requirements

All seniors at Logan-Rogersville High School who will graduate this May and will attend a vocational, trade, technical school, community college, or a university may apply. The following application form must be submitted to the LRHS Counselor's office by the last day in March.

Selection Process

- 1. The counselor's office will remove the student' name and cover page from the application.
- 2. All applications will be reviewed by a scholarship committee and a winner selected. This committee is formed by the Community Foundation of the Ozarks.
- 3. The scholarship recipient will be announced on or before LRHS's "Senior Honors" night.
- 4. Payment will be made directly to the college into an account in the recipient's name. It is the winner's responsibility to notify the counselor's office with the college's address and phone.
